



Dos and Don'ts of remote proctor enabled assessment

A remote proctored assessment is an online exam or test that is monitored virtually to ensure the same level of integrity as a traditional in-person exam. And the test needs to be completed within the given date and time, which you will be shared shortly.

Assessment link will be active only between the timelines mentioned

Here are the essential Dos and Don'ts to ensure your exam isn't flagged or cancelled.

✅ The "Dos" (Prepare & Succeed)

- **Do a "System compatibility Tech Run" 24 hours before:**
Do follow the given link <https://systemcheck.talent-next.com/> provide a system compatibility link. Test your webcam, mic, and internet speed on the **same network** you'll use for the test.
- **Do clear your desk entirely:** Only have the essentials (laptop, mouse, and any specifically allowed items like a transparent water bottle). Remove all pens, paper, and books unless the rules explicitly permit them.
- **Do check your lighting:** Ensure light is hitting your **face**, not coming from behind you. If you are silhouetted against a window, the AI will "flag" you because it can't track your eye movements.
- **Do inform your household:** Put a sign on your door. An unexpected "guest" (even a pet or a roommate) walking into the frame is often grounds for immediate disqualification.
- **Do dress appropriately:** Remember you are being recorded. Treat it like a professional interview or an in-person exam.

❌ The "Don'ts" (Common Red Flags)

- **Don't look away from the screen:** Avoid staring at the ceiling or out a window while thinking. Proctors may flag this as "looking at hidden notes."
- **Don't read questions out loud:** Many systems flag "whispering" or "mumbling" as a sign that you are dictating questions to a hidden recording device or a person in the room.
- **Don't use headphones:** Unless explicitly told otherwise, **headphones are strictly forbidden** because they could be used to receive answers from an external source.
- **Don't use Caps which can cover your head/face/ears**
- **Don't leave the camera frame:** Most proctored exams do **not** allow bathroom breaks. If your face disappears from the webcam for even 10 seconds, the test may auto-submit and lock you out.
- **Don't use a second monitor:** Most proctoring software will detect a second display immediately and won't even let you start the test until it's unplugged.
- All programs e.g., zoom etc. or applications like MS Teams etc. that use the webcam, mic & screen share should not be used during the test.
- The materials and contents of the examination should not be recorded in any way.

- Min of 4Mbps speed of internet is required to complete the assessment without any hassle
- If the test platform or browser closes, or if your system disconnects, please wait **two minutes** before logging back in to continue your assessment within the scheduled time.
